A. Covid Updates for Birchwood Middle School

- 1. Masks are still being worn
- 2. Mask breaks have stopped as a result of RIDOH guidance.
- 3. Classrooms being "fogged" each night.
- 4. Lunch continues to be eaten in the classrooms. Gym classes eat in the cafeteria.
- 5. Many families are opting their students back into in person learning.
- 6. Basketball for both boys and girls is now underway.

B. Thanksgiving food drive- final push

- 1. Feinstein will not be sponsoring a food drive.
- 2. Items donated will be used to create Thanksgiving baskets for needy Birchwood families.
- 3. Birchwood staff is donated the turkeys for the baskets.
- 4. Excess items were donated to Stephen Olney foodbank. Over 400 excess items.
- 5. 21 Baskets for Thanksgiving and 19 for Christmas. All with Turkeys and pies.

B. Adopt a family for Christmas holiday.

- 1. Birchwood staff adopted families in need for the holiday season.
- 2. Baskets will be made and distributed with gifts for the holiday season.
- 3. 21 families were assisted with gifts for children and gift cards for families.
- 4. Students made cards for families in the hospital and nursing homes.

C. Family Engagement strategies.

- 1. Weekly family update sent from the principal.
- 2. Teams will send a weekly update on the happenings in the classrooms geared towards instruction and assessments.
- 3. P.T.O. will be restarted once the pandemic restrictions are lifted.
- 4. Principals will visit feeder schools in the spring of incoming 5th graders.
- 5. Middle School parents night will be held in person or virtually if required in the Spring of 2021.

E. R.I.C.A.S. Test Preparation

- 1. Teachers start now for the test in the Spring.
- 2. After school ramp up instruction for targeted subgroups and subject areas.
- 3. Incentives developed via the P.B.I.S. committee for students achievement & effort.
- 4. Content Leaders shift content meeting to a focus on R.I.C.A.S. and gaps that were identified earlier in the year.
- 5. E.L.A. testing is scheduled before April vacation.
- 6. Math Testing is scheduled for after April vacation.
- 7. 8th grade science testing will take place in mid to late May.

F. Chromebooks

- 1. The devices have been holding up nicely.
- 2. B.M.S. is working with the technology department to pilot a program for how the chromebooks are collected when they need to be serviced.
- 3. The turnaround time for getting a device fixed is currently two to three days.
- 4. Many parents have purchased insurance which has cut down on funds spent on the school level to fix broken devices.
- 5. Safe search access is now given to the Principal @ Birchwood. This allows the students to be counseled about the inappropriate search that they conducted on the district device.

2nd Quarter Academic Achievement

- 1. The 2nd quarter ends on 1/29/21.
- 2. Report cards will be available to parents on 2/5/21 via Skyward online.
- 3. A concern exists for students that have not been attending school either virtually or in person.
- 4. Teachers have contacted families via phone calls, e-mails as well as holding parent meetings.
- 5. Support staff along with our school resource officer have conducted home visits.
- 6. The truancy officer has been involved in extreme cases.

- 7. The residency officer has been informed of students that we believe are no longer living in the district.
- 8. Teachers will continue to focus on priority standards for students.
- 9. Administration is looking into the possibility of running a summer program based on the expedition of the vaccine and pandemic effects.
