NORTH PROVIDENCE SCHOOL DEPARTMENT KINDERGARTEN EARLY ADMISSION POLICY	Approved: 5/27/2020

Purpose: To implement consistent procedures regarding the appropriate placement of children entering Kindergarten.

General Admission Criteria:

In accordance with Rhode Island General Law 16-2-27 – "Every child who has or will have attained five (5) years of age on or before September 1 of any school year shall be eligible to attend Kindergarten during all the days that the Kindergartens are in session during the school year."

Residency Requirement:

• Student must be a documented resident of the Town of North Providence.

Consideration for Early Admission into Kindergarten:

- Child must celebrate his/her fifth birthday on or before September 15th (No Exceptions) of the year of admittance to be considered for the Early Admission Process.
- Child must be a documented resident of the Town of North Providence.
- Superintendent must approve a written request from the parents or guardians to begin the Early Admission Process by <u>August 1st</u> of <u>desired enrollment year.</u>
- School must have adequate space to accommodate a child younger than age five (5) on or before September 1st without causing additional staffing and overages.
- Child must be evaluated by North Providence educators regarding academic and social maturity to determine if the child has a good chance for success entering Kindergarten early.
- Child will have one attempt. No re-assessments permitted.
- Child must achieve the following evaluation scores on <u>all</u> assessments to be considered for early admission:

 RI Learning & Development Standards: Social & Emotional Development as measured by: Ages and Stages Questionnaire; Social- Emotional 2nd Ed. (If currently enrolled in Pre-School/Daycare, your child's teacher will complete this). 	Meet 60 mos. Benchmark
 Must pass Child Outreach Screening. 	

- The parents or guardians must submit physical, vision and hearing records/assessments dated within six months of early entrance request.
- This Policy will be reviewed annually.
