## **Data**

- C. Bozigian and M. Branco delivered a presentation on school data (State Testing Data and AP data.
- Some important information to note is that for our Report Card, we can only be
  as high as our lowest category, which is why we have a two despite having fours
  and fives in some categories.
- The DiplomaPlus criteria was an added criterion.
  - o Our CTE graduates will help with this criterion.
  - We will also be looking into implementing NOCTI for additional certifications.
  - EVERFI is 1/3 of a credential.
  - We are also attempting to move the EMT certification exam up before graduation.
- The district can't be any higher than our lowest-performing school which means our report card score impacts the district's score.
- We are trying to offer more AP courses.
- PSAT, SAT, NextGen Science, we had a strong participation rate
  - SAT (NPHS, ERW 487; State 480) (NPHS, Math 460; State 530)

- NPHS is ahead of the benchmark by 7 points in ELA, NPHS is ahead of the Stee by 14 points in math)
- For PSAT, English is one point below the state benchmark; math is above the state benchmark
- COVID impacted scores due to learning loss
- Our goal is to improve 3-5%
- Both ELA and Math have implemented action plans and we will continue to revisit how we can grow.
- We are hopeful that having no masks and more social interactions will help boost scores and make up for the crucial years of learning that our students lost due to COVID
